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### 1. Introduction

This document describes the processes and outcomes implemented during the third year of the WYRED project (García-Peñalvo, 2016b, 2017; García-Peñalvo & Kearney, 2016; Griffiths et al., 2017), M25-M36 (November 2018 – October 2019). It depicts the project situation at October 2019, M36.


The document constitutes the fourth deliverable of the WP9 and it follows the project management handbook (WP9\_D9.1) and the previous yearly reports (WP9\_D9.2, Year 1 annual report, and WP9\_D9.3, Year 2 annual report). Joint with the quality and evaluation annual report (WP10\_D10.10), D9.4 provides a picture of the project last achievements and challenges faced during this period until the end of the eligible period.

The reporting activity implies an overview of the implementation of the workplan and of the products delivered (in particular deliverables, reports, publications, products of the dissemination activities); the analysis of the management results and the main achievements.

- Management.


As indicated in the Grant Agreement, the delivery of the management report has been fixed yearly, so three versions of the document have been delivered at the end of each of the three project years (M12, M24 and M36). Nevertheless, updated intermediate versions of the report have been provided along the project, making them coincide with face to face project meetings and online periodical meetings, where the partners shared information about the local progresses and were made aware of the global evolution of the project. Taking in account that the cyclical structure of the WYRED project processes (WYRED Consortium, 2017c, 2017d) does not always fit to the traditional organization of work packages and reporting, this aspect was crucial to ensure a well-balanced distribution of the WYRED initiatives among the partners' geography.







A complete financial report has been provided in M19, at the end of the first reporting period (RP1, M1-M18), joint with the periodic technical and financial report (GA 20.2 and 20.3, p.29). Both final technical and financial reports will be delivered within 60 days of the end of the project (by 31<sup>st</sup> December 2019). The final project review will take place in Luxembourg next 14<sup>th</sup> January 2020. #### Abstract:

The emergence of the young as a distinct social group, and their slowly increasing empowerment through the availability of digital technology, has brought with it an understanding that they have a key role to play in the digital society, as drivers of new behaviours and understandings. However, their active participation in society is not reflected sufficiently in policy and decision-making, especially in relation to digital issues. Because of this, they are not well represented and unheard, and this makes it hard for research and policy to identify and understand their needs. These issues are further complicated by the fact that the group is a swiftly moving target, it is as heterogeneous as the wider society, and young people can be unwilling to be subjects of research.

The WYRED project (netWorked Youth Research for Empowerment in the Digital society) aims to provide a framework for research in which children and young people can express and explore their perspectives and interests in relation to digital society, but also a platform from which they can communicate their perspectives to other stakeholders effectively through innovative engagement processes. It will do this by implementing a generative research cycle involving networking, dialogue, participatory research and interpretation phases centred around and driven by children and young people, out of which a diverse range of outputs, critical perspectives and other insights will emerge to inform policy and decision-making in relation to children and young people's needs in relation to digital society.

The project is informed by the recognition that young people of all ages have the right to participation and engagement. It has a strong focus on inclusion, diversity and the empowerment of the marginalised. The aim is to replace the disempowering scrutiny of conventional research processes with the empowerment of self-scrutiny and self-organisation through the social dialogue and participatory research.

### 2. Outcomes and Results of the Year 3

### 2.1. The WYRED cycle

According to the project proposal, the WYRED project is designed to work in cycles (WYRED Consortium, 2017c, 2017d). The project work plan involves 10 work packages. The WP1 involves the **definition of the different processes** involved in the research cycle, and the WP2 is devoted to the preparation and implementation throughout the project of the **inclusion strategy** (WYRED Consortium, 2017a, 2018), the WP3 focuses on the development of the WYRED platform (García-Holgado & García-Peñalvo, 2018; García-Peñalvo, 2016a, 2018; García-Peñalvo & Durán-Escudero, 2017; García-Peñalvo & García-Holgado, 2019; García-Peñalvo, García-Holgado, Vázquez-Ingelmo, & Seoane-Pardo, 2018; García-Peñalvo, Vázquez-Ingelmo, & García-Holgado, 2019; García-Peñalvo, Vázquez-Ingelmo, García-Holgado, & Seoane-Pardo, 2019; WYRED Consortium, 2017b), which will be used throughout the project as the space in which the activities and interaction take place. After these first three preparatory WPs, the next 5 cover the full cycle of activity in WYRED. This starts with network building in WP4, in which the children and young people who will participate in the research cycle are attracted and engaged and the principal themes that represent their concerns are identified. The next work package (5) focuses on social **dialogue** around these themes which will explore the themes to identify key research questions relating to the digital society that concern children and young people. In the subsequent work package (6) these children and young people, supported by the partners, will focus on designing and implementing research activities to explore these questions and issues in a range of different ways. WP7 focuses on the interpretation and evaluation of the process and its results





in the production types by the young research participants and the partners, of different formats and artefact that will be used to present the results, principally insights and recommendations to different target groups at policy level and in the wider society. The final phase of the cycle in WP8 focuses on the **dissemination and exploitation** of these results, though this work package runs throughout the project engaging in the valorisation of the WYRED activity through workshops, event participation, online activity and an association. **These 5 work packages form a cycle** that is aimed to generate insights relating to the perspectives and concerns of children and young people in relation to digital society. The WYRED cycle is supported by 2 other work packages focusing on **management** (WP9) and **quality** (WP10).




Figure 1: Relation between the workpackages according to the project proposal (GA Part B p.29)

### 2.2 Deliverables produced (M1-36)

The table below lists the deliverables produced from November 2016 to October 2019.

The list of deliverables follows the structure of the GA 1.3.2. WT2 list of deliverables.

The processes described, and the outcomes produced reflect the results of the implementation of the WYRED 1<sup>st</sup> cycle (December 2016, M2 – February 2017, M15), WYRED 2<sup>nd</sup> cycle (July 2017, M9 – August 2018, M22) and WYRED 3<sup>rd</sup> cycle (September 2018, M23 – August 2019, M34). Data on the 1<sup>st</sup> cycle implementation and results have been provided inside the technical report which followed the RP1 (M1-M18) in M19 (D6.3. First cycle Activity artefacts collection). The development







of the research actions both in presence in each local context and online in the WYRED platform continued after M19 and their implementation produced new key research questions (D5.4. Key research questions v2) and the recommendation collection as result of the evaluation and interpretation process of social dialogues and research actions (D7.5. First Cycle Recommendations collection and D7.6 Second Cycle Recommendation collection).

On this base, the 3<sup>rd</sup> cycle was implemented during the 3<sup>rd</sup> project year. Activities continued until the last days of the project, when the WYRED online festival took place from 22<sup>nd</sup> to 24<sup>th</sup> October 2019 (https://wyredproject.eu/online-festival/).

The last deliverables expected for the end of the project are still in the drafting phase, at the time of writing this report, due to the need to collect updated information on the online festival and the latest events promoting the results of the project carried out during the months of September and October. They will be uploaded to the SyGMa platform along November 2019.

### 3 Implementation of the workplan

#### 3.1 Current situation at M36

As described in the GANTT chart below (Figure 2), the plan initially designed was to have the **cycle** repeated twice during the funding period of the project. After the funding period, it is expected to continue indefinitely under the aegis of the WYRED Association.

The 1<sup>st</sup> 2 cycles were planned so to take place during the funding period and the third to begin just as the period ends.




Figure 3: Timing of the work packages according to the project proposal (GA Part B p.29)

As part of the reflection process on the implementation of first cycle and with the objective to address the need to tune the project timeline with the flows and rhythms of young people's participation, the initial task schedule has been rethought and updated at the end of the first project year (see D9.2).

The main assumptions agreed by the partners at this regard and implemented during the second year were:

- Reorganizing the timing of the cycles. Instead of beginning after the start of the calendar year, the 2<sup>nd</sup> cycle has been brought forward to autumn 2017 so that the key periods of the cycle do not coincide with times when the majority of young people are unavailable due to exams and other commitments in late spring and summer.





- Assuming an overlap between the first cycle and the second one. So, the first cycle followed the scheduling described in the proposal (December 2016, M2 – February 2018, M15) and it was considered as an "experimental" cycle and the second started before the period initially scheduled on July 2017 with the implementation of the initial networking actions and social dialogues and continued the activities until August 2018, M22, where the more active period was from September 2017 to May 2018 following the school year. It had the benefit that, as well as addressing the schedule issue, it allowed the project to implement a full cycle before the end of the 2<sup>nd</sup> project year, on time for the second annual reporting, and to have a third complete cycle to be implemented in the 3<sup>rd</sup> project year.

#### The periods of the 3 cycles are:

- WYRED 1<sup>st</sup> cycle: December 2016, M2 February 2018, M15.
- WYRED 2<sup>nd</sup> cycle: July 2017, M9 August 2018, M22 (main activities took place from September 2017 to May 2018 following the school year).
- WYRED 3<sup>rd</sup> cycle: September 2018 August 2019.

At the end of the 2<sup>nd</sup> year, the deviations described in D9.3 (timing of the activities according to the different realities and cycles of young people's activity in different countries and full use of the WYRED platform) suffered during the first year were corrected and the project was back on schedule. The 3<sup>rd</sup> cycle implementation ran without relevant issues to note, demonstrating that the mechanisms set-up in the previous cycles were correct.

The other deviation reflected in D9.3 was due to the delay in the advisory board set-up. The delay in the constitution of the advisory board has involved a reprogramming of the 6 scheduled meetings that has had repercussions on the calendar of the meetings and the delivery of all the relative deliverables, until the end of the project.


After a slight delay in the delivery of D8.1, the implementation of the work package worked well.

#### **COMMENTS**

There are three main dimensions to the work, internal processes managed with the partners, an external advisory board which has met periodically to discuss the progress of the project and suggest improvements, and an ethical dimension which comprises an internal Ethical Advisory Board to ensure ethical issues are taken into account throughout the project in line with the provisions of the Participant Protection Policy document, and two independent ethical reviews.

The second dimension of the work package, the Advisory Board suffered some delays, due to issues relating to the availability of potential members who had been strongly recommended by the consortium, so the original schedule proposed for Advisory Board meetings have been re-organized, which led to a delay in the meetings and in the related delivery of the deliverables.

D10.10 will be delivered by the end of November, when the internal quality review will be completed.

### 4 Impact Year 3




Figure 4: WYRED Social media dissemination strategy

A specific space is operative for facilitating the technical and financial reporting issues, where guidelines, templates and personalized support if offered by the USAL team to the partners.




Figure 5: Redmine. Management of the project implementation (all partners) - GANTT








Figure 6: Redmine. Management of the project implementation (all partners) - FORUMS




Figure 7: Redmine. Technical management of the platform development (P1 developers' team)




Figure 8: WYRED Zenodo community




Figure 9: WYRED collection at GRIAL institutional repository
