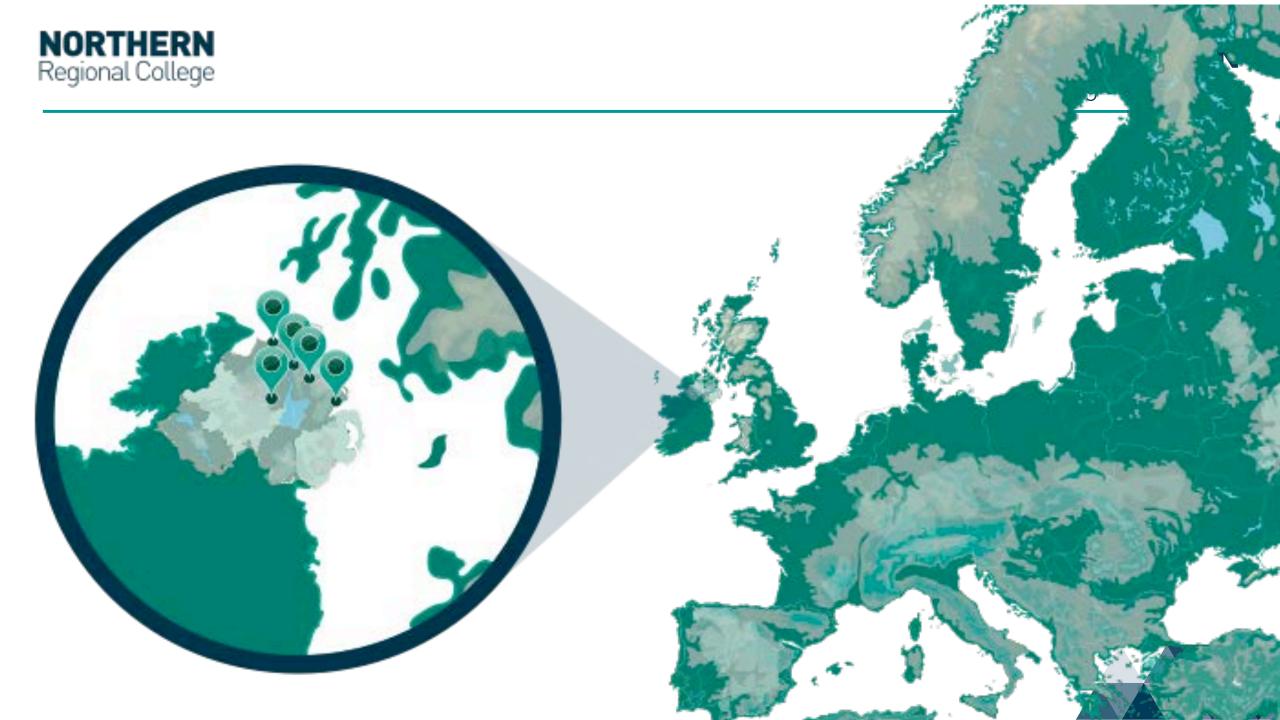

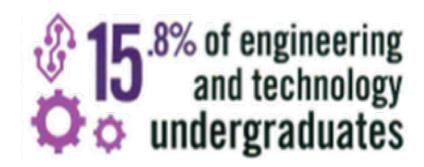
50% of STEM enrolments, including medicine are unevenly distributed by discipline:

39.9% of physics undergraduates

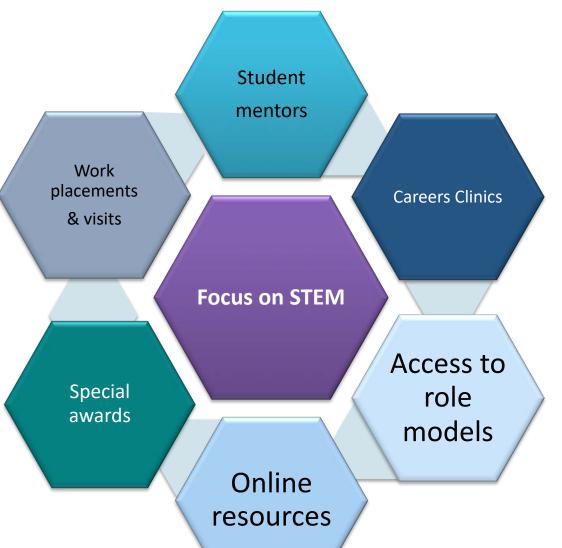

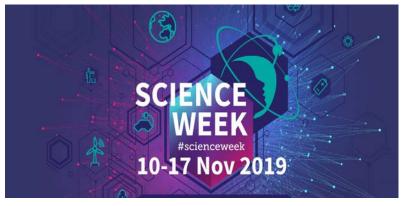
